A Message to Our Community on Our 85th Anniversary

This year, the Greater Miami Jewish Federation marks our 85th anniversary, a remarkable milestone for any nonprofit organization and even more notable because our founding came 10 years before the creation of the modern State of Israel. Before we look ahead, let us take a moment to look back at this extraordinary past year.

Israel 75 Miami Mega Mission

To commemorate Israel's historic 75th anniversary, Federation brought more than 800 people to our Jewish homeland on the Israel 75 Miami Mega Mission in April 2023 — the largest delegation in the world to gather for Israel's momentous occasion. (This was following a Pre-Mission to Poland, with 185 participants.) In Israel, through a week of inspiring educational, social and spiritual activities, including visits to Federation-funded sites and daily Mega Events, our community came together and:

- Raised more than \$2.8 million for the Annual Federation/UJA Campaign
- Engaged a record number of Young Leadership participants and donors at new giving levels
- Added 130 new Lions of Judah
- Achieved commitments to The Foundation totaling more than \$28 million in current and expected gifts.

The impact of this Mission on our community-building efforts will last for years to come.

Caring for the Vulnerable

At a time when one in five Jewish Miamians depends on Federation for some form of financial assistance or access to Jewish life — up 60 percent from just a few years ago — Federation is as relevant and necessary as ever. Where individuals and families in Miami, in Israel and around the world are struggling, we are there, thanks to the support of you, our generous volunteers and donors, as well as the longstanding partnerships of local, national and overseas agencies.

A difficult economy brought challenges this year to individuals and families already living on the edge, as inflation significantly raised the prices of even the most basic necessities. Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, Federation responded to those facing economic difficulties with our monthly Free Kosher Food Distribution Drive-Thrus — a program that continues to serve more than 1,500 people each month. As of this writing, we have hosted 45 Drive-Thrus, serving more than 67,500 people.

Antisemitism and Community Security

An issue of great concern for the Jewish community continues to be the dramatic rise in Jewish hatred and acts of antisemitism. Our Federation's Office of Community Security has worked tirelessly on many fronts to educate our community leaders on securing Miami's Jewish institutions, while our Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) has built bridges between various communities to increase tolerance and understanding. Together, we are keeping our community more secure by:

- Sponsoring the introduction of Community Security Services to Miami, after raising more than \$1 million to secure \$750,000 in matching funds from the Jewish Federations of North America
- Securing \$100,000 in grants to combat antisemitism
- Holding an urgent Press Conference on Antisemitism during *Chanukah*, with 15 Miami-area mayors and Jewish community leaders speaking out against Jew hatred
- Arming high school juniors and seniors and their parents with tools to speak about antisemitism and Israel on campus by organizing the Israel U workshop

Supporting Ukrainians and Aliyah

In February 2022, Russia began its brutal attack on Ukraine, creating a refugee crisis not seen since World War II. Again, Federation's support of our overseas partner agencies enabled us to immediately respond and bring help and hope. In addition to taking vulnerable Ukrainians and Russians to safety in Israel and other countries, we provided vital humanitarian relief to those unable to leave. Last year, Israel experienced the largest influx of new *olim* (immigrants) in decades, with 70,000 arriving from 95 countries. The majority came from Russia and Ukraine, but hundreds more immigrated from Ethiopia, many reuniting with families and fulfilling the dream of a lifetime.

Creating a Welcoming Community

Here at home in Miami, our Federation works to continue to build a welcoming community, address pressing issues and advance Jewish life. Here are some of the ways:

- Launching the BeWell Miami Youth Mental Health Initiative, to address the mental health crisis, especially among our youth
 - Striving to create a caring, inclusive and united community rooted in Jewish values and traditions. We embrace and value differences, such as ethnicity and national origin, religious denomination and spiritual practice, race, age, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, socio-economic levels and mental and physical ability.
- Hosting all events in person for the first time since the beginning of COVID-19, with several events completely sold out
- Presenting the High Holiday Welcome Program for the 23rd consecutive year and enabling more than 1,000 Jewish people to participate in High Holiday worship services at local synagogues at no charge

Of course, all of these accomplishments are made possible thanks to our community's steadfast support of the Annual Greater Miami Jewish Federation/UJA Campaign, which in 2022-2023 raised \$24.8 million — the sixth consecutive year where we exceeded the previous year's fundraising achievement. How amazed Federation's founders would be if they were here today. When they raised their first dollars for a community chest for vulnerable Jews following *Kristallnacht*, they could only imagine that, 85 years later, tens of millions would be raised annually by thousands of leaders, donors and volunteers committed to collective Jewish responsibility. Today, we celebrate all those who have brought us to this momentous anniversary, and we look forward to a bright shared future, supported through the dedication of people like you.

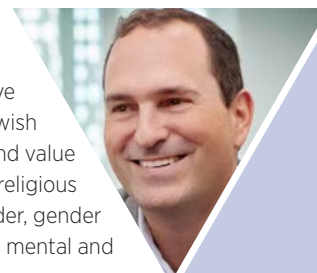

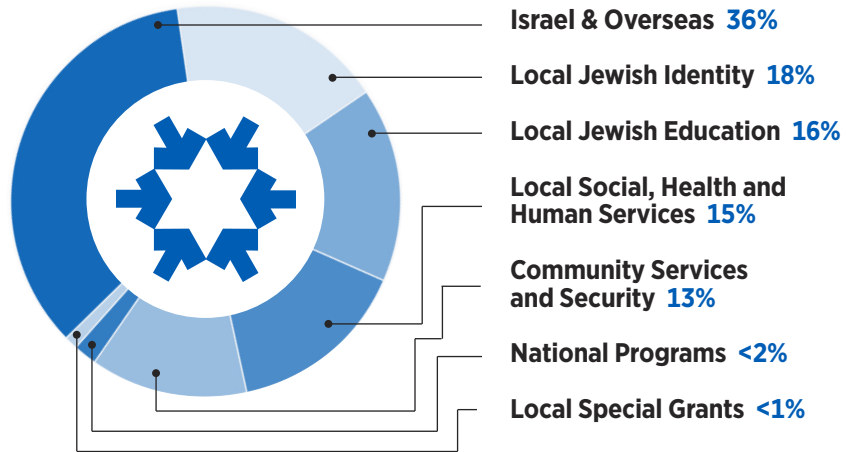

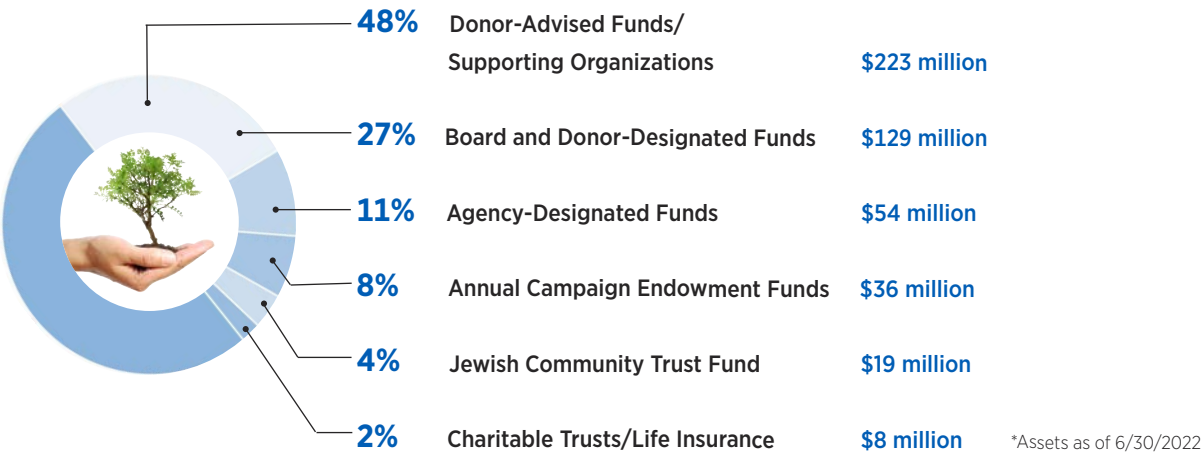
Thanks to the generosity

AS OF JUNE 30, 2022,
The Foundation held **\$469 million** in assets, representing **770** donor families and organizations.

During 2022, The Foundation received **\$47 million** in contributions and bequests to new and existing funds and **\$37 million** in grants were distributed to Federation, local beneficiary agencies and other charities.

The Jewish Community Trust Fund is Federation’s unrestricted endowment made up primarily of bequests, large and small, from donors seeking to enhance our collective Jewish future.



Campaign Endowment Funds (Lion of Judah Endowment Funds/Forever Lion or Forever Pacesetter Funds) are permanent endowments established by donors to perpetuate a gift to the Annual Federation/UJA Campaign. These funds provide support in the name of the donor or loved one to Federation to care for those in need, meet unexpected challenges and plan for the future.

Donor-Advised or Philanthropic Funds are like “charitable bank accounts,” allowing donors/families to make charitable contributions when the time is right, while realizing important tax advantages.

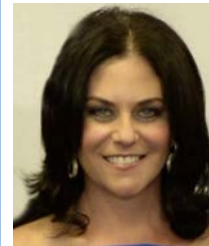

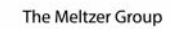

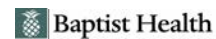
