Protecting Women Against Violence

\$11,900

General Support: Aims to engage men and boys in efforts to eliminate violence toward women in all its forms in public and private spheres.

ASSOCIATION OF RAPE CRISIS CENTERS: CHANGING LAWS, CHANGING LIVES

\$25,000

General Support: Aims to improve services offered to victims of sexual assault and promote social change on a national level.

MASLAN: ESCORT FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE THROUGH LEGAL PROCESS

\$30,000

Support for victims of sexual and physical violence; escort to legal proceedings; legal advice, emotional support, training workshops for law enforcement, volunteer training, support and enrichment.
