Hand in hand with generous donors, dedicated volunteers and visionary leaders, the Greater Miami Jewish Federation works tirelessly to bring together Jews of all ages and backgrounds and invite them to join us in our Mission.

This *Report to the Community* provides a snapshot of the financial aspects of our organization this past year, including Annual Campaign dollars raised and allocated, as well as assets held and distributed by The Foundation.

We are also delighted to share some of Federation's other achievements for 2024-2025:

- The **release of [Jewish Miami: A 2024 Community Study](#)**, whose valuable data helps local organizations serve existing and emerging needs
- Presenting the **Tribe of Nova Music Festival Exhibition** attracting 60,000 visitors to bear witness to Hamas' brutal terrorism of October 7
- **The Main Event**, a sold-out evening for 1,700 — our largest event ever — focusing on October 7, virulent antisemitism and anti-Israel sentiment

- The **Young Leadership Division Masquerade Ball**, another sold-out event with 600 young adults passionate about building a vibrant Jewish future
- A powerful gathering in Tallahassee coordinated by our **Jewish Community Relations Council**, with 175 Miamians joining 37 other organizations to advocate for the Jewish people
- Thirty-one security trainings by our **Office of Community Security** at local synagogues, JCCs and other institutions
- More than 2,150 volunteers donating nearly 14,000 hours of hands-on service through our **Jewish Volunteer Center** and an additional 10,500 hours provided by 175 **Mishkan Miami**-trained volunteers to support vulnerable people across Miami

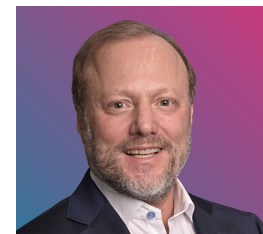
As we look ahead, we are excited about what the future holds.

Our Impact During Fiscal Year 2024

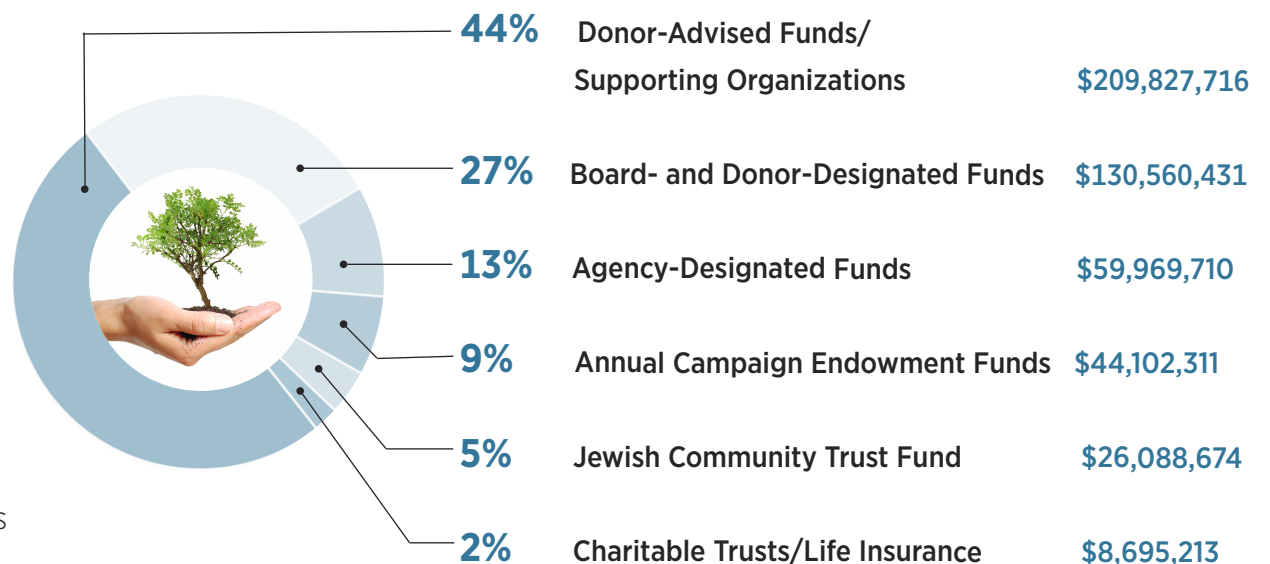
\$21.2 million in contributions and bequests made to new and existing funds

A total of nearly **\$54 million** in grants distributed to local beneficiary agencies and other charities, including nearly **\$23 million** to Federation. This consists of:

- **\$1.5 million** from the Jewish Community Trust Fund (Unrestricted Funds)
- **\$1.3 million** from Campaign Endowment Funds to the Annual Campaign
- **\$11 million** from Board/Donor-Designated Funds
- **\$9 million** from Donor-Advised Funds/Supporting Organizations
