
Women's Philanthropy mourns the tragic loss of our Campaign Chair Amanda Adler's beloved daughter,



Women's Philanthropy salutes two Women of Valor who are assuming top leadership roles at Federation. Lily Serviansky has been installed as Chair of the Board of the Greater

Miami Jewish Federation and Mojdeh



Khaghan Danial has been appointed the organization's General Campaign Chair. Both positions, made official at Federation's 86th Annual Meeting on May 30, will be effective

July 1 and continue for two years. Serviansky succeeds Ariel Bentata, who served with distinction as Board Chair since 2022. The two women were both born outside the US and are illustrative of one of the most diverse Jewish communities in the nation. Born in Mexico, Serviansky most recently served as General Campaign Chair and led the effort to raise nearly \$27 million for the Annual Greater Miami Jewish Federation/UJA Campaign and nearly \$30 million for the Israel Emergency Fund, the latter of which was launched the day of the horrific October 7 terrorist massacre in Israel. Serviansky is a passionate community leader, having served as Chair of The Foundation of the Greater Miami Jewish Federation, President of Temple Beth Am in Pinecrest and in key roles in other community nonprofits throughout Miami-Dade County. Danial was born in Iran and most recently served Federation as both Jewish Community Relations Council Chair and Major Gifts Chair. She has served in numerous other Federation positions over the years, most notably as Women's Philanthropy President from 2010 to 2012. An attorney by profession, she has been involved in various causes in our community, including healthcare, education and civic engagement. Serviansky and Danial assume these leadership positions at a pivotal moment for Jews


